### DESCRIPTION

The Springfield Rescue Mission is a leader in meeting the physical and spiritual needs of the hungry, homeless and poor in Greater Springfield. We provide food, shelter, clothing, medical attention, counseling, literacy training and advocacy – **free of charge** through our Emergency Shelter, Rehabilitation Center, Transitional Living Facility, and Give Away Center.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the Springfield Rescue Mission, since 1892, is to meet the physical and spiritual needs of the hungry, homeless, addicted, and poor by introducing them to Christ and helping them apply the Word of God to every area of their lives.
