DESCRIPTION

The Springfield Rescue Mission is a leader in educating the public to the needs of the poor in Greater Springfield. As an Emergency Shelter, Rehabilitation Center and Transitional Living Facility, we provide food, shelter, clothing, medical attention, Christian counseling, literacy training and advocacy – **free of charge**.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Springfield Rescue Mission, since 1892, is to meet the physical and spiritual needs of the hungry, homeless, addicted, and poor by introducing them to Christ and helping them apply the Word of God to every area of their lives.

BASIC SERVICES

83,878 meals for men, women, and children

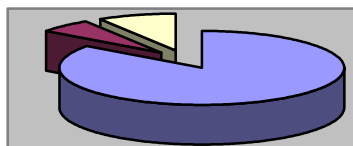
