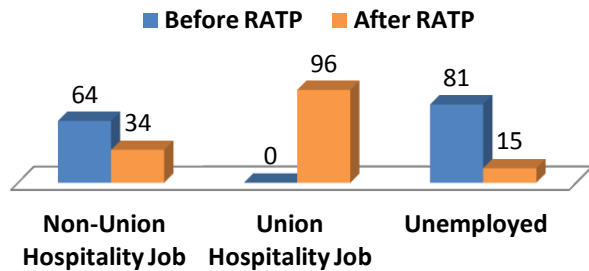




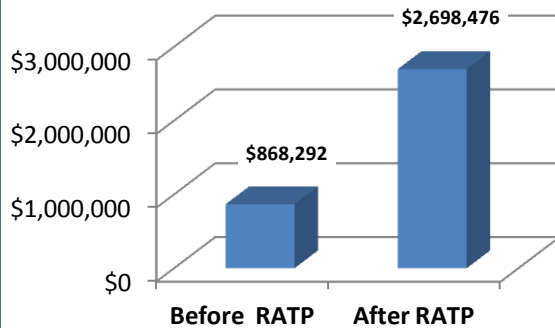
Between 2008 and 2013, 145 participants completed the Room Attendant Training program (RATP) preparing them for good employment with high hourly wages in a growing industry.

Prior to completing the Room Attendant Training program (RATP), many participants were unemployed or employed at a position where they were not receiving benefits.

Employment Status



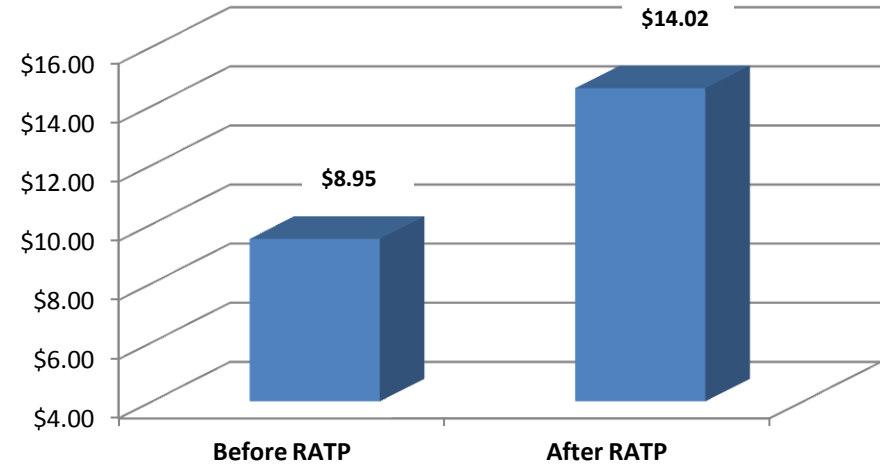
Annualized Income



After completing the Room Attendant Training program (RATP) and finding new employment, the total annualized earnings for the participants has more than tripled.

The 64 participants that were employed prior to completing the Room Attendant Training program (RATP) were not earning much more than the minimum wage. After completing the program, the average wage for all employed increased \$5.07 (56%).

One of the most important elements of the Room Attendant Training program (RATP) is that many of the participants find employment that offers employer sponsored health insurance. Prior to participating in the program 7 individuals received health insurance from their employer, after completing the program 109 received employer sponsored health insurance.
